Re: Planned Parenthood's Distribution of Pharmaceutical in Violation of RSA 318:42

To Whom It May Concern:

I am writing on behalf of my client, New Hampshire Right to Life, regarding the dispensation of pharmaceuticals at Planned Parenthood of Northern New England's six New Hampshire clinics. These clinics are all licensed as "Limited Retail Drug Distributors" with the following addresses and license numbers:

Upon information and belief, Planned Parenthood does not have a pharmacist on site at any of its six clinics, but distributes birth control, the morning after pill, RU-486 and other pharmaceuticals relating to its family planning and abortion business.

Pursuant to RSA 318:42, it is "unlawful for any person who is not a licensed pharmacist in a pharmacy registered in accordance with the provision of this chapter to manufacture, compound, dispense, sell, offer for sale or have in possession any prescription drug as defined in RSA 318:1(XVII)." Nevertheless, there are certain exceptions that allow the dispensation of pharmaceuticals by a non pharmacist. For example, pursuant to RSA 318:42(VII), it is lawful for the "dispensing of non controlled prescription drugs by registered nurses in clinics operated by or under contract with the Department of Health & Human Services, or by such nurses in

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clinics of non profit family planning agencies under a contract with the Department of Health & Human Services provided that" Until July 1, 2011, Planned Parenthood was a grantee of the New Hampshire Department of Health & Human Services for the provision of family planning services under the Title X program. It appears that prior to July 1, 2011, Planned Parenthood was dispensing pharmaceuticals pursuant to the family planning clinic exception of RSA 318:42(VII). Nevertheless, when Planned Parenthood's contract with New Hampshire Department of Health & Human Services terminated, so did their right to dispense pharmaceuticals in accordance with this exception. A few days after the expiration of the contract, on July 5, 2011, Meegan Gallagher, the Senior VP of Planned Parenthood of Northern New England, called Michelle Ricco, the Family Planning Program Manager for the New Hampshire Department of Health & Human Services, and stated:

"PPNNE is currently seeing patients, but with no contract, they have lost their dispensing privileges, so they are not handing out contraceptives but rather Rx and directing their clients to cost effective pharmacies."

I have attached a copy of the e-mail that NHRTL recently received detailing Planned Parenthood's understanding that they could not lawfully dispense pharmaceuticals without a pharmacist or a contract with the New Hampshire Department of Health and Human Services as Exhibit A.

Throughout the summer of 2011, it appears that Planned Parenthood gave its clients prescriptions which they then had to get filled at licensed pharmacies. Some clients presumably went to the nearest pharmacy (see attached Exhibit B showing the Rite Aid pharmacy that is immediately adjacent to Planned Parenthood's Manchester clinic), while other clients presumably went to pharmacies that cost less than Planned Parenthood. DHHS suggested that Walmart sells the pill cheaper than Planned Parenthood. See attached Exhibit C.

Planned Parenthood does not currently have a contract with the New Hampshire Department of Health & Human Services and has not had one since July 1, 2011. Nevertheless, it appears that Planned Parenthood has been dispensing pharmaceuticals since September 14, 2011¹ and intends in June of 2012 to apply for renewal of its Limited Retail Drug Distributor's license to continue dispensing pharmaceuticals without a pharmacist in its six New Hampshire abortion clinics.

Planned Parenthood is dispensing a substantial amount of pharmaceuticals. It dispenses over \$4,000 of pharmaceuticals a day. See attached as exhibit D. Therefore, on behalf of my client, I respectfully request that the Board of Pharmacy take all appropriate action to prevent Planned Parenthood from violating RSA 318:42 as they are no longer a grantee of the

¹ Planned Parenthood has had a contract with the federal department of Health and Human Services for family planning services since September 13, 2011. Nevertheless, RSA 318:42 (VII)'s exemption is for clinics under contract with the N.H. Department of Health & Human Services. See He-C 201.02 clearly defining Department as "the **New Hampshire** department of Health and Human Services."

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Department of Health & Human Services and, therefore, no longer fit within the exception of RSA 318:42(VII).





Subject: NH Update

Hello - Just got the following on the high level NH meeting held to day on the PPNNE/FP funding situation.

The meeting involved Michelle, Gov. Lyntch, reps from the AG's office, Commissioner Toumpas, and EC member Sununu and the purpose was to look at options and strategies to fill the gap in family planning services created by the rejection of the PPNNE Contract.

The governor's office has been in touch with PPNNE and they say they have kept their clinics open thus far, althoughn they are not providing medications, and the board will decide toaay what to do next. Currently, under NH law and regulations PPNNEhave no ability to dispense contraception and as a result they estimate that they are losing \$4,000/day.

The state is trying to come to a best case way to fill the gap in services. Here are the opitions/

1. They have some hope that they may be able to move the counselors to adopt a new contract with PPNNE - the new contract would have revised dates and numbers and also would include language to spell out the restriction on using these funds for abortion and require audited reprots that support it. NH officials will test whether this option might allow any movements in the counsel.

If this doesn;t work ---

- 2. NH could execute sole source extentions to current contracts (even those that are not for FP) to enable those providers to offere family planning services. These providers would either provide services directly or subcontract in some cases they could liek to subcontract with PPNNE. This would be a least a short term solution until rebidding could occur...or it could be a ltonger term solution and depending on how subcontracting went would fill part of the gap...
- 3. NH could rebid the area now served by PPNNE this would mean that it would be unlikely that servcies could be restored in this way before late fall at the best.
- 4. They could tell us that they cannot deliver services and we sould need to rebid.

In the meantime NH is interested in issuing a minor contract to pPNNE to enable them to meet the requirement we are putting on them to notify patients fo the options. We woulld have approval of this letter which would outline options for clients including letting them know what other services are available, where to get low cost RX drugs, etc. They feel that this would held them avoid litighation, keep PP sites open, although not in full Title X status NH would ask that PP keep reporting theri service numbers. I think I suppor this action which is a placeholder becasue it is providing funds for PP to do the notification of clients that we are telling NH to do. BH really can't do it because they don;t have access to client information.

So - Hopefully, we can discuss this early tomorrow to see what we think. Then we need to push it on to Sue.

Thanks for all your support through this... and I have to say that we should send a letter or somethign to Michelle or to Jose about Michelle saying how much we appreciate her work on this, and her extra efforts to keep us fully informed.

Hopefully we can talk tomorrow. I will be in the office by 8 AM. K
